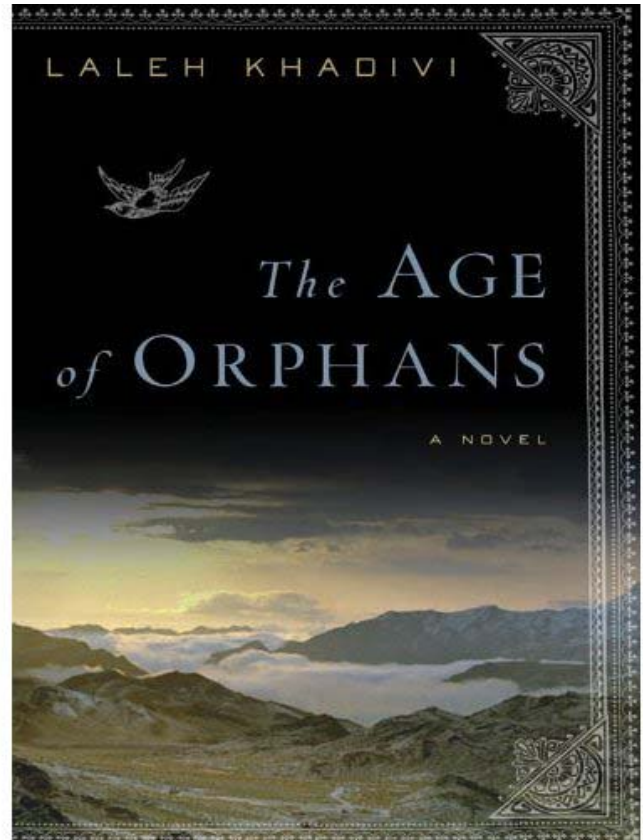


The Age of Orphans

Laleh Khadivi was born in Iran in 1977. In 2002 she began to research the Kurds, particularly their fate in the southwestern region of Iran under the first Shah.

Laleh has worked extensively as a documentary filmmaker, has taught at Emory University and won the 2008 Whiting writers award.
